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MISSION STATEMENT

Midland Park School District, as part of a strong, dedicated community, provides students with a comprehensive, adaptive education within a positive environment by maximizing all resources, empowering them to realize their individual worth, and responsibility with the expectation that all students achieve the New Jersey Core Curriculum Content Standards at all grade levels.

COMMUNITY - The high school serves the town of Midland Park, a community of 7,128 residents located in Northwest Bergen County within 20 miles of New York City. The citizens maintain a high level of interest in the educational system. Per pupil tuition expenditures for 2016-2017 are estimated to be **\$19,519.00**

Midland Park High School is a comprehensive four-year high school which continually strives to meet the needs of all its students and prepare them for life after high school. The current school enrollment is **319 students**. Midland Park High School is accredited by the New Jersey Department of Education and the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools, a member of the College Entrance Examination Board and a host school for the Bergen County Special Services Secondary Hearing Impaired Program (S.H.I.P.).

STAFF PROFILE - The professional staff at the high school consists of a total of 50 certificated educators, the majority of whom have advanced degrees.

Curricular and Programs

To receive a Midland Park High School diploma, all students must demonstrate mastery of language arts and mathematics by meeting defined criteria:

English Language Arts:

PARCC ELA Grade 9 >=750 or PARCC ELA Grade 10 >=750 or PARCC ELA Grade 11 >=725 or SAT Evidence-Based Reading/Writing Reading >=450 or SAT Reading Test >=22 ACT Reading or ACT PLAN Reading >=16 or Accuplacer Write Placer >=6 or Accuplacer Writer Placer ESL>=4 PSAT 10 Reading or PSAT-NMSQT Reading >=22 or ACT Aspire >=422 or ASVAB-AFQT >=31 or Meet the Criteria of NJ DOE Portfolio Appeal

Mathematics: PARCC Algebra I >=750 or PARCC Geometry >= 725 or PARCC Algebra II >=725 or SAT Math Section >=440 or SAT Math Test>=22 ACT or ACT PLAN Math >=16 or Accuplacer Elementary Algebra >=76 or PSAT 10 Math or PSAT/NMSQT Math >=22 or ACT Aspire >=422 or ASVAB-AFQT >=31 or Meet the criteria of the NJ DOE Portfolio Appeal.

Students must also earn 126 credits. Midland Park High School provides students with the opportunity to take honors level and advanced placement level courses.

All students are required to take:

- Four years of English
- Four years of physical education/health
- Three years of mathematics
- Three years of science
- Three years of social studies
- One year of world language
- One year of visual, performing and/or practical art including but not limited to, photography, sculpture, instrumental and choral music, theater and media arts, T.V. production.
- Students are required to take one semester of economics or personal finance
- Technological literacy is integrated throughout the curriculum.

Elective Courses: Students choose elective courses in all subject areas. Students may also elect to attend Paramus Vocational and Technical School for part-time vocational and technical training. These courses are designated as such on the transcript.

Senior Option II Program Seniors can also obtain credit through the Option II program – an alternative to traditional high school courses such as career internships and college classes.

Advanced Placement courses are offered in:

Chemistry, Calculus AB, English Literature and Composition, English Language and Composition, French Language, Macroeconomics, Spanish Language, U.S. Government, U.S. History, Psychology, and Studio Art.
