Please note, as of the 2017-2018 school year, students in the Class of 2021 need to pass PARCC Algebra I and PARCC ELA 10 as a graduation requirement. This year, there is a new science test for students in grades 8 and 11. As always, the AP Exams will be administered in the first two weeks of May (dates and times are pre-determined by the College Board). We understand this time of year may be busy and overwhelming, especially for those students preparing for the college admissions exams.
