Option II Programs and Guidelines

(N.J.A,C. 6A:8-5.1(a) 1ii)

Option II extends flexibility at the local level by allowing schools to choose from an array of models for developing activities or programs linked to the Core Curriculum Content Standards, such as: interdisciplinary and theme-based programs; independent study; co-curricular and extracurricular activities; magnet programs; student exchange programs; distance learning opportunities; internships; community service; or other structured learning experiences.

General Procedures

Applications for Option II Programs are located in the guidance office. Option II is available to 12th grade students only. Students must complete and submit an application by June 1 for the fall semester and by December 10 for the spring semester. In order to be awarded credit, prior administrative approval by the Option II Committee must be obtained before enrolling in any Option II Program.

Any costs incurred as a result of an Option II Program will be the responsibility of the parent/guardian. The Board of Education will not assume any responsibility for any fees associated with this program.

The teacher or instructor will record student achievement and attendance for the duration of the course. Progress will be reported every marking period to on PowerSchool as in any other course.

Workplace training, apprenticeships, internships Grade 12 students may earn up to 10 credits through an approved structured learning experience in an area of career interest. To be eligible for a structured learning experience, the student must be on track for meeting graduation requirements. Students are required to maintain and submit a journal, write a final career research paper, and present a Final Exhibition to Option II committee members in order to demonstrate that they have met the goals and objectives of the experience.
Community Action Program	Pass (P) or Fail (F) grade awarded. Credits count toward graduation requirements. Not included in GPA.	Community Service Students may volunteer (without any monetary compensation) outside of their scheduled day in elementary schools, pre-school programs, health/safety related fields, or the community and receive credit. For every 28 hours of service, students will earn one credit. A maximum of 5 credits will be applied to graduation requirements.

Requirements for all Structured Learning Experiences and Community Action Programs

- 1. You must attend the Structured Learning Experience (SLE) for the agreed upon hours.
- 2. If you are absent from school, you may NOT attend your internship or work.
- 3. If you are unable to attend your SLE, even though you attended school, you must contact me IMMEDIATELY. You can find me in school or email me at twecht@mpsnj.org
- 4. You must write one-full page bi-monthly in a journal detailing your experiences for the week. This is your chance to discuss likes and dislikes about your job, your facility, and your colleagues.
- 5. This journal must be submitted every other MONDAY to Mrs. Wecht. Late journals will directly affect your grade.
- 6. The first journal entry MUST discuss ALL safety procedures, including placement of fire extinguishers and all plans in place for any emergency on the job (including fire drill procedures, injury procedures, etc.).
- 7. Each journal entry should include detailed descriptions of experiences and an analysis of the way these experiences will help prepare you for a career.
- 8. At least one journal entry per marking period will research one aspect of the career and relate the research to the work experience. The research may include any of the information from the O-Net online at http://www.ónetonline.org/, Junior Achievement Center at http://studentcenter.ja.org/Careers/Research/pages/default.aspx and the US Department of Labor Occupation Outlook website at http://www.bls.gov/ooh.
- 9. At the end of the Option II experience, each student must complete the following:
 - a. You must produce a 3-5 page typed research paper analyzing the career paths available in the career cluster. This paper must include possible jobs, work environment, requirements for education, median income, earning potential, job outlook, and other interesting facts. The paper must connect this researched information specifically with the work experience. This information can be found at the abovementioned sites.
 - b. You must present a Final Exhibition at the end of the school year, which includes photos, details, research in the field, and a discussion of the work experience. This Exhibition will be presented before members of the Option Two Committee.
- 10. Marking period grades will be based on the following:
 - a. Timely submission of journal entries (journals will be submitted Monday mornings every other week starting Monday, September 16, 2013);
 - b. detail and depth of reflection in journal entries;
 - c. Reports and reviews of mentors.
- 11. Final averages will include the Final Exhibition.
- 12. Students enrolled in paid SLEs must submit a copy of their paystubs to verify hours and wages.
