## Standardized Test Requirements for Graduation

## New Jersey Graduation Proficiency Assessment (NJGPA)

- New test for the 2021-2022 school year. №
- & All students must take the assessment
- & Assessed on English and math

## Graduation Requirements For Class of 2023

Students **must** take the NJGPA, and have an opportunity to pass one from each column

#### **ELA**

- & NJSLA ELA 9 >= 750
- & NJSLA ELA 10 >= 750
- & NJSLA ELA 11 >= 725
- & SAT >= 22
- & ACT >= 16
- & PSAT 10 >= 22
- & ASVAB >= 31

#### Math

- k NJSLA Algebra I >= 750
- NJSLA Geometry >= 725
- k NJSLA Algebra II >= 725
- & SAT >= 22
- & ACT >= 16

- $\otimes$  ASVAB >= 31

Option 2 is an elective course for senior students who have fulfilled their standardized test graduation requirement:

- •Credits for Option II are determined based on the number of hours per week.
  - Full year courses are 5 credits.
  - Semester courses are 2.5 credits.

#### **School to Work**:

Students have classes in the morning and then go to their job/internship in the afternoon.

#### **Dual Enrollment:**

Students start their college career early spending part of their day at MPHS and then enroll in college courses.

#### **On-line courses:**

#### **Application Process**:

- Dual-Enrollment classes are weighted as honors classes on the GPA scale.

- & Upon graduation, students will receive credits from the college.

  - Medical Terminology Honors Rutgers University
  - Computer Programing Honors Seton Hall

Each course will cost approximately \$300.

## Junior Year

- & Go on Naviance to explore college and career interests
- & Junior Conferences (letter will be mailed home with more details)
- & Course Elective Selection (week of January 18th)
- & Standardized Testing for College Admission in Spring
- & Finish Junior Year Strong Academically
  - NOTE: The grades at the end of junior year are the last grades that go into the cumulative GPA that colleges will see when applying

## Planning Your Senior Year

- & Class placement is based on **teacher recommendations**
- & Communicate your academic goals with teachers and guidance counselors
- & Maintain a rigorous senior year schedule
  - ø Colleges see senior year schedule and can request report cards
  - ø Guidance Office automatically sends mid-year reports (mid-year grades) at the conclusion of semester 1 with a re-calculated GPA

Outdated school of thought → "have an easy senior year"



- Naviance Student is career and college readiness platform that enables students for self-discovery, career exploration, academic planning, and college preparation.
- © Guidance Counselors use Naviance to track and analyze data about college and career plans Contains admissions data for recent MPHS graduating classes
- ∀ The students' supporting documents (letters of recommendation, transcripts, and school profile) are sent through Naviance.

#### & Students must be academically eligible for athletics

- ø Each division (division I, II, III) has its own standards/criteria
- ø Guidance counselors send in transcripts to the NCAA
- ø Students must submit SAT/ACT test scores to the NCAA (even for test optional schools)

- & Helps students and their families pay for college
- - ø tuition and fees, room and board, books and supplies, and transportation
- - ø Grants, scholarships, work study and loans.
- & Each college has a Financial Aid Office

#### FAFSA & CSS Profile

#### & FAFSA

- go The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is the form to get any financial aid from the federal government
- প্ল No fee required

#### & CSS Profile

- An online application to determine eligibility for non-federal financial aid
- ಶ Some (not all) colleges require submission of CSS Profile (must do your own research)
- প্ল Fee required
- & Both can be filed as early as October 1st of senior year

## Scholarships

- & Colleges may offer scholarships based on merit and/or need
- & Corporate Scholarships are listed on Naviance
- & Local Scholarships are posted in the Daily Bulletin
- & Announcements/postings are also made on Class of 2023 Google Classroom
- & Due dates for scholarships usually in late winter/spring
- Not necessarily just for high achieving academics/merit © Criteria could be hobbies, activities, potential programs of study (i.e. nursing, business, etc.)
